NEW FUND-RAISING INITIATIVE WILL BEGIN IN JULY 2020!

With the generosity of all the wonderful friends of Brevillier Village we have exceeded our fund-raising goal for the New Village Van in less than a year. The Van was picked up June 11th. We were supposed to have delivery in April of this year but with the recent events this was slightly delayed. But we are so excited to show off this new vehicle to residents, families, staff and friends who donated to this project in one way or another.

In reviewing the needs of the Village, it has been decided that our new fund-raising initiative will be a new nurse call system. The systems we have are between 20 and 40 years old. They are becoming obsolete with all the new technology. The new

systems have many more features that can improve the care delivery system as well as the quality of life for residents. We have formed a team of staff members that is researching the various systems and their functionality. We estimate these could cost anywhere from \$125,000 to \$200,000 dependent on how many buildings we replace with these new systems.

We have been amazed at the support for our last two fundraisers, St. Paul's Chapel and the Van. Please watch for information which will be distributed this summer.
