Future Visitation Protocols at Brevillier Village

As we are winding down the COVID vaccination of residents and staff, I have been receiving many questions about visitation for residents, families, and friends.

Our last day of vaccination distribution will be March 15th, 2021, and will be the last clinic at the Village. The Village received the Pfizer vaccine. We will be vaccinating staff and residents who still require their 2nd vaccination to complete the series for optimum coverage against the virus. We are so proud that overall, 96% of the residents of the Village have received the 2-step vaccination. That is a wonderful number. The CDC recommends at least a 2–3-week period after the 2nd shot to have the maximum coverage.

Beginning on Wednesday, March 17th we will once again have indoor visits available in a controlled setting for Conrad House, Barnabas Court, and Ball Pavilion. You should have received a phone call, letter, email, or check the website for complete details for the visits regarding all of the buildings. These visits will not change anything for those on Hospice or residents who are actively passing away. We will continue visits as long as we have no COVID-positive residents or staff at the village. We are also looking towards warmer weather soon so we can initiate outdoor visits again.

If you or family members, friends have received the 2-step vaccination, or the 1 step Johnson & Johnson please bring your card in so we can make a copy. It may affect future visitation requirements. Please remember- these visits can change at any time due to many factors.

I know you have all been so very patient, but with the new strains in the US, I think the CDC and government are still being very cautious. It is certainly encouraging to see the number of cases and hospitalizations going down.
