Changes effective Wednesday September 22nd, for Residents and Families

MASKING is still required in Long Term Care settings

Visitation- NEW UPDATE

NEW: This update is in consideration of the new COVID Delta Variant and anticipation of continued high positivity rates during fall and winter.

Visitation will continue to be scheduled with an appointment. You are still required to screen prior to your visit. Will remain at 3 visitors per resident per visit.

Pets can visit residents for indoor and outdoor visits. We must have updated shot records from vet and flea treatment on file for pets to visit at Brevillier Village. Please contact Marti Colliss Director of Recreation or Kayla Turk for any questions.

NEW: For resident birthdays or special event please call to make special arrangements during months October 2021 thru April 2022. The events will be limited to 6 people including resident. Call Vicky Wittuck or Val Savoia to make arrangements.

We are removing the age limit for children. We do NOT recommend bringing children under the age of 2 years old, but that is a personal decision.

Residents and Visitors that are **VACCINATED AND NON-VACCINATED** will be able to be on the grounds for walks or sit by the front door if they do not want to walk the grounds weather permitting. All Visitors and non-vaccinated residents must wear a mask. Visits are not to exceed an hour and a half.

VACCINATED VISITORS will be able to go to resident room to get resident and sign them out and back in ON THE UNIT in the building.

Indoor visits for Vaccinated and Non-Vaccinated residents will remain in the front conference room and the Ball Pavilion Recreation Room and will be 1 ½ -hour visits. PPE will be dependent on your vaccination status.

VACCINATED visitors may take residents for car rides and/or visits at family member homes (for less than 24 hours) and should wear masks.

We do NOT encourage **NON-VACCINATED** visitors and **NON-VACCINATED** residents to go for a car ride or go to a family members home. If they do, the resident will need to quarantine for 5 days or longer if they develop symptoms.

ISOLATION/QUARANTINE

VACCINATED RESIDENTS:

Emergency Room Visits- no quarantine required unless they have been there more than 24 hours or if resident develops symptoms. If this occurs, they will need to Quarantine for at least 7 days with a COVID test on day 5.

Residents admitted from home or hospital stay on admission or readmission will be required to quarantine for 7 days with COVID test on Day 5. If they develop symptoms their quarantine could be extended.

Residents who go to public events such as dinner at a crowded restaurant, wedding, large family gatherings, family home visit (over 24 hours), or traveling/vacationing etc. when they return, they are required to quarantine for 5 days with a BINEX test on day 5. Their quarantine could be extended if they begin to show any symptoms.

NON-VACCINATED RESIDENTS

NON-VACCINATED residents will continue to quarantine for 14-days regardless of whether they are in the Emergency Room, hospital, go out to a crowded public event, go home with family, etc. They will be tested on day 12 with a Nasal Swab and released on day 15 or when we receive a negative test result.

Appointments for visits are still necessary as we are continuing to limit the number of people in Ball Pavilion to avoid unnecessary exposure.

Ball Pavilion must be extra cautious since residents reside in semi-private rooms and not all residents are vaccinated

Barnabas Court Visitation protocols:

October 15, 2021

Barnabas Court North—RED ZONE--Controlled Compassionate Visits

Barnabas Court North is able to schedule half hour visits between 10 am and 3 pm on weekdays in the front conference room. Families can schedule visits through the BC North Secretary Emily.

There can be one visit per resident per week, with only 2 people per visit. This gives each family a chance to come and visit. Residents with Covid are not allowed to have visits until their isolation time is over.

Families may not go into the building to get their resident. When you arrive, the staff will escort the resident down to the front office. The table with the divider will be wiped down between each visit, please respect your allotted time so that we can prepare for the next visit.

Visitors are to go to Ball Pavilion as they have in the past but are to be in full PPE including Mask, gown, and gloves during their visit.

This will continue until Barnabas Court North is back in a green zone again!

Barnabas Court South

The South building is still in a green zone so residents are allowed to have guests as they wish, but all visitors **MUST STILL STOP AT** Ball Pavilion to screen and get the proper PPE. Visits can be indoors or outside.

Barnabas Court **SOUTH**

Changes effective Friday September 24th, 2021, for Residents and Families.

Visitation- New Update

NEW: This update is in consideration of the new COVID Delta Variant and anticipation of continued high positivity rates during fall and winter.

Visitation will no longer need to be scheduled for SOUTH but, YOU STILL MUST STOP at Ball Pavilion to screen and get the proper PPE.

We are removing the age limit for children, and we are increasing visits to 3 people per appointment. We do NOT recommend bringing children under the age of 2 years old, but this is a personal decision.

Pets can start visiting residents again for indoor and outdoor visits. We must have updated shot records from vet and flea treatment on file for pets to visit at Brevillier Village. Please contact Marti Colliss Director of Recreation or Kayla Turk for any questions.

NEW: For resident birthdays or special event please call to make special arrangements during months October 2021 thru April 2022. The events will be limited to 6 people including resident. Call Jean LaFuria or Vickie Gilchrist to make arrangements.

Residents and Visitors that are **VACCINATED AND NON-VACCINATED** will be able to be on the grounds for walks or visit by the front door at North or in the Courtyard in South as long as **ALL** Visitors/Resident wear a mask, weather permitting.

Outdoor visits are not to exceed 1 ½ hour and indoor visits not to exceed 2 hours. **INDOOR** visits must be in resident apartment and not in public spaces. PPE will remain the same dependent on your vaccination status.

VACCINATED visitors may take residents for car rides and/or visits at family member homes (for less than 24 hours) and should wear masks. We do NOT encourage **NON-VACCINATED** visitors and **NON-VACCINATED** residents to go for a car ride or go to a family members home for less than 24 hours. But if they do, the resident will need to quarantine for 5 days or longer if they develop symptoms.

ISOLATION/QUARANTINE

VACCINATED RESIDENTS:

Emergency Room Visits- no quarantine required unless they have been there more than 24 hours or if resident develops symptoms. If this occurs, residents will need to Quarantine for at least 7 days with a COVID test on day 5.

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Residents coming from home or hospital stay on admission or readmission will be required to quarantine for 7 days with BINEX test on Day 5. If they develop symptoms their quarantine could be extended.

Residents who go to public events such as dinner at a crowded restaurant, wedding, large family event (meaning more than 4-5 people) or gathering, family home visit (over 24 hours), or traveling/vacationing etc. when they return, they are required to quarantine for 5 days with a BINEX test on day 5. Their quarantine could be extended if they begin to show any symptoms.

NON-VACCINATED RESIDENTS

NON-VACCINATED residents will continue to quarantine for 14-days regardless of whether they are in the Emergency Room, hospital, go out to a crowded public event, go home with family (over 24 hours), etc. They will be tested on day 12 with a Nasal Swab and released on day 15 or when we receive a negative test result.

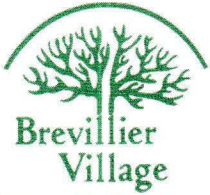
We do not encourage residents to be in groups or with individuals who are not vaccinated, especially when experiencing COVID surges.

Conrad House Update

Effective September 23, 2021

VISITATION: NEW UPDATE:

This update is in consideration of the new COVID Delta Variant and in anticipation of continued high positivity rates during fall and winter.

- A maximum of 3 visitors can visit after screening in the Conrad House lobby and getting the proper PPE.
- Vaccinated visitors must always wear mask and visit only in the apartment
- Unvaccinated visitors must always wear a mask and face shield and visit only in the apartment
- Residents and Visitors that are **Vaccinated and Unvaccinated** can be on the grounds for walks and visits as long as **ALL** visitors/residents wear a mask, weather permitting

ISOLATION/QUARANTINE VACCINATED:

- New residents moving in must isolate in their apartment for 7 days if vaccinated with a BINEX on day 7.
- Emergency room visits- no quarantine required unless you have been there more than 24 hours or if resident develops symptoms. If this occurs, residents will need to quarantine for 7 days with a COVID test on day 7.
- Residents coming home from the hospital will be required to quarantine for 7 days with a BINEX test on day 7. If you develop symptoms, your quarantine may be extended
- Residents who go to public events such as dinner at a crowded restaurant, weddings, large family events or gatherings or traveling/vacationing etc. when you return, you are required to quarantine for 7 days with a BINEX on day 7. Their quarantine could be extended if you begin to show any symptoms.

LARGE GATHERINGS

Large group events continue to be limited to 25 residents.

NON-VACCINATED RESIDENTS:

NON-VACCINATED residents will continue to quarantine for 14 days regardless of whether they are in the Emergency Room, hospital or go to a crowded public event etc. They will be tested on day 12 with a Nasal Swab and released on day 15 or when we receive a negative test result.
