

New Visitation Guidance for Ball Pavilion at Brevillier Village

Trial Program to begin Monday, December 20th, 2021

With new guidance's by the Federal government through the Centers for Medicaid and Medicare, Ball Pavilion is required to open up visitation but with specific limitations:

- We will be trying this process through the end of 2021 to see how it works. Adjustments may be made to ensure resident, family, and staff safety.
- There can no longer be specific scheduled times for visitation. We also can not set a time limit for visits or how many visits a resident has each day.
- **We will be allowing visitation based on specified visiting spaces within the facility.** Since BP has mostly semi-private rooms this is allowable and creates a safe space for visiting off the units. There must be safety protocols followed such as social distancing, masking, and full PPE if needed.
- We still **STRONGLY** encourage you call 15 minutes ahead to check availability and let us know you are coming that day so we can reserve a visitation space for you and your loved ones. You can call the BP secretary to have a space reserved for **THAT DAY.**
- You will be assigned a space for visitation when you call ahead.
- If you do **NOT** call ahead you will take a chance that a space may not be available. You may have to wait until a place opens up or come back a later time or day.
- Residents on Hospice or Short Term stays that have private rooms will not need to call ahead but are to visit in the resident room only. They can not come out in any public areas when visiting.

We feel comfortable with up to 4 visitors at a time for all visits, this does not include the resident.

It will be mandatory that visitors wear masks at all times while visiting. You must continue the screening process which includes hand washing and using the screening kiosks.

We would appreciate visitations during regular business hours:

Monday thru Friday	8am until 8pm
Saturdays and Sundays	9am until 4pm

We appreciate everyone's cooperation and patience as we try this new process, see how it works and attempt to keep everyone as safe as possible!

The goal is to keep COVID out of the facility, so we do not have to restrict visits in the future.

With holidays approaching please notify all family members of new protocols.

Please do NOT visit if you are sick, have had an exposure, or are experiencing COVID-like symptoms.



BARNABAS COURT NORTH VISITATION

As of December 15, 2021

Visitors are welcome in to visit residents of Barnabas Court North this holiday season.

- Visitors are asked to call ahead to schedule a time to come in, this ensures that we do not overwhelm our memory support residents. By calling ahead it also allows the staff time to make sure the residents are ready for their visits.
- Six visits can be scheduled at a time.
- There will be no time limits on visits.
- Number of visitors at a time will be 4 so that social distancing can still be done in residents' rooms.
- If a larger group of family would like to come in together, or visitors for a resident with a roommate want to visit, the BCN front conference room can be used.
- There will be no restrictions on the number or visits a resident can have in a day as long as there is room on the schedule.

All visitors must still go to Ball Pavilion to wash hands, screen, and get a mask and badge from the screening station. If guests come into Barnabas Court North **without** a badge, they will be asked to leave and go to Ball Pavilion to screen and get their badges.

All visitors are to go directly to the resident's room without spending time at the nurses station, recreation room or visiting with other residents.

We would appreciate visitations during regular business hours:

Monday through Friday	8am until 8pm
Saturdays and Sundays	9am until 4pm

We ask that everyone follow these guidelines so that all the Barnabas Court residents can remain healthy as they enjoy their visits from family and friends.
