Prohibited Items: Outside Medications

A reminder to families with residents at Ball Pavilion and Barnabas Court (personal care residents)... Please do not bring in any of your own prescription or over the counter (OTC) medications for residents in these buildings. This includes but is not limited to Tylenol or Advil, Tums/Roloids, Pepto-Bismol, Cough Drops, Biofreeze or Bengay products, anti-itch lotions, Vics VapoRub, etc. There are strict regulations for each building to operate efficiently, and we need to make sure there are orders from a doctor for any medication. If you have any questions, please feel free to reach out to the Social Workers, nursing staff, or building Administrators.

Be Aware of Scammers

Please be aware! Phone scams target senior citizens by exploiting their trust, polite nature, and accumulated savings, resulting in billions of dollars in annual losses. In recent years, fraudsters have heavily escalated their tactics, incorporating advanced technology like AI voice cloning alongside traditional high-pressure telephone schemes. Please take a moment to review the tips and tools to staying safe from becoming a victim of financial and/or identity scams. **Where to Report Fraud and Seek Help: IF YOU OR A RESIDENT YOU KNOW HAS BECOME A VICTIM OF FRAUD, PLEASE REPORT ANY SUSPICIOUS ACTIVITY TO THE BUILDING ADMINISTRATOR IMMEDIATELY!** If you or a family member has been targeted, acting quickly within 24 to 48 hours gives you the best chance to recover lost funds. Need a Ride? Take EMTA Route 260



Erie Metropolitan Transit Authority



Did you know that Brevillier Village is a daily stop for the E-Erie Metropolitan Bus? That's correct, Route 260 makes three stops daily Monday through Friday (with the exception of holidays). EMTA recommends that all seniors interested in riding the "e" for free sign up for the Free Senior Identification card. By showing this card you may ride any EMTA bus for free. An application can be mailed to you or you can fill one out at the EMTA offices. Seniors can apply for a FREE bus pass. Applications

are processed and passes are issued at the Intermodal Transportation Center located at 208 East Bayfront Parkway during business hours. Proof of age is required to receive the ID card.

Pennsylvania Medicare Education and Decision Insight (PA MEDI)

The Pennsylvania Department of Aging offers the PA MEDI program (formerly APPRISE) to provide seniors within the community free Medicare counseling. Counselors are specially trained to answer questions and provide objective, easy-to-understand information.

This program provides:

- Understand Medicare eligibility and enrollment
- Understand your Medicare benefits by explaining what services are covered under Medicare Parts A and B and your Medicare Summary Notice
- Understand your Medicare Prescription Drug (Part D) benefit
- Make informed choices about Medicare coverage options, Medigap policies and Medicare Advantage Plans
- Understand financial assistance programs that may be available to help pay for your Medicare premiums, deductible and co-pays, as well as your prescription drug needs (Extra Help and Medicare Savings Plan)
- Understand and assist with the Medicare appeal process
- Understand benefits under Long-Term Care policies
- Presentations on Medicare to your group or organization

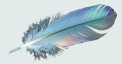
Remembering Our Loved Ones

National Preparedness Month

Take steps to prepare with your family.

The theme for 2026 is "Americans Stand Ready," which focuses on resourcefulness, self-reliance, and civic duty in protecting loved ones and communities.

Key Steps to Prepare

- **Know your risk:** Learn what types of emergencies or severe weather are most common where you live.
- **Make a plan:** Write down emergency contact details, meeting spots, and specific needs for family members & pets.
- **Build a kit:** Gather essential supplies like water, non-perishable food, medications, and first aid items.
- **Stay informed:** Download tools like the FEMA App or sign up for local emergency alerts.
- **Get involved:** Learn life-saving skills like CPR or sign up for local volunteer opportunities.

Please Be Aware - Technology Safety

Please be aware! Phone scams target senior citizens by exploiting their trust, polite nature, and accumulated savings, resulting in billions of dollars in annual losses. In recent years, fraudsters have heavily escalated their tactics, incorporating advanced technology like AI voice cloning alongside traditional high-pressure telephone schemes.

Common Phone Scams Targeting Seniors

- **Government Impersonation:** Callers spoof numbers to pretend they are from Social Security or the IRS, threatening arrest or benefit cuts unless immediate payment or private information is provided.
- **Medicare & Health Insurance:** Fraudsters claim to be Medicare representatives demanding card renewals, identity verification, or offering "free" medical equipment to steal Medicare numbers for bogus insurance billing.
- **Grandparent & Family Emergency:** Criminals use social media details or AI voice cloning to mimic a grandchild in distress, urgently demanding money for bail, accidents, or travel.
- **Tech Support Scams:** Scammers use fake computer pop-ups or cold calls pretending to be tech support companies to gain remote device access or charge fake diagnostic fees.
- **Bank & Financial Services:** Fraudsters send alerts regarding fake "suspicious activity" to manipulate seniors into revealing passwords or transferring funds into secure accounts.
- **Sweepstakes & Lottery:** Victims are told they won a large prize but must pay upfront taxes or processing fees via wire transfer or gift cards to release it.
- **Utility Shut-Off Threats:** Callers pose as local utility workers claiming services will be disconnected immediately during extreme weather unless a bill is paid over the phone.

Major Red Flags to Watch For

- **Immediate Urgency:** Demanding fast action before you have time to think or consult family.
- **Unusual Payment Methods:** Requesting gift cards, wire transfers, cryptocurrency, or non-traditional cash apps.
- **Unsolicited Government Contacts:** Outbound calls from Medicare or Social Security asking you to verify your identity or number.
- **Secrecy Demands:** Telling the victim not to speak to anyone else about the situation.

How to Protect Yourself and Loved Ones

1. **Hang Up and Call Back:** If someone claims to be from an official agency, hang up immediately. Dial the verified number listed on your official statement or the Social Security Website.
2. **Never Share Sensitive Numbers:** Do not give out your Social Security, Medicare, or bank account numbers over the phone to unsolicited callers.
3. **Screen Unknown Numbers:** Let unfamiliar calls go to voicemail to filter out automated robocalls and spoofed numbers.
4. **Establish a Family Password:** Create a secret phrase with your family members to verify their identity if you receive a frantic emergency call.

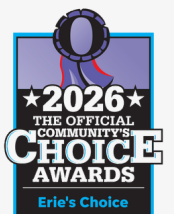
